EXPO SHOW REMINDERS

1. In order for any points to be awarded, the cattle must be owned by, entered in the name of, and shown by the individual IJBBA member, the only exception being if the exhibitor has two or more animals in the same class.
2. All Breed Champions and Reserves must stay for the Championship selection on Sunday. No points or premiums will be awarded if the respective winners are not present for the Championship Drive.
3. Exhibitors are stabled by counties with only one stall per exhibitor allowed per entry.
4. Use of hemp hair, removed hair, or other hair-like materials added to the animal's body will not be allowed. I.J.B.B.A. does not allow surgical or any other alterations to the animals such as the use of permanent dyes or paints to alter the animals original color pattern. Exhibitors found in violation of this rule will be stripped of all their points and premiums for that day and all animals will be disqualified from the remainder of the show. After their third offense, it will be considered a code of conduct violation and will be handled accordingly.
5. No junior cattle will be allowed in the barn until barn managers give the OK.
6. All cattle must have health papers and original registration papers in hand at time of check-in. Absolutely **NO FAX COPIES OF REGISTRATIONS ALLOWED FOR ANY BREED!**
7. All breed associations reserve the right to blood-type/DNA/retinal eye scan any cattle being shown within their breed divisions.
8. Under **NO** circumstances will exhibitors be allowed to artificially fill animals through the use of pumps or bottles or any other unethical means.

FANS - FANS - FANS

Exhibitors are reminded that butt fans or fans of any kind sitting in the aisles are prohibited at the Expo. Fans hanging from blocking chutes are also prohibited. Only overhead hanging fans will be allowed. Due to limited space, management reserves the right to limit exhibitors on the number of and arrangement and design of fan equipment if it is excessive and infringes on the rights of other exhibitors.

Generators, Space Heaters & Gas Cans are NOT allowed in any barn or in the tie-out barn! If any one person and or family is caught with a running generator or space heater inside any building on the Iowa State Fairgrounds, you are subject to forfeiture of the right to show and all premiums, due to Iowa State Fire code and this will enforced by Iowa Beef Expo officials!

Junior Cattle Check-in

Friday, Feb 17th 8:30 AM to 12:30 PM

ALL junior cattle, purebred and crossbreds will be checked in Friday, Feb 17th beginning at 8:30 A.M. in the Livestock Pavilion. Check-in will close at 12:30 P.M. All animals need to have health papers to exhibit. Purebred steers and heifers must bring their registration papers with them at the time of check-in. Commercial heifers and all market animals will be weighed for class breaks.

STALLING & SIDE PANELS

Juniors will be stabled by county at the 2012 Iowa Beef Expo. Be sure to mark on the entry form what county you are from. Counties will be randomly assigned an appropriate number of stalls based on the number of entries received. **Exhibitors from each county will be responsible for working out their own stalling arrangement within their assigned stalls.** Due to the large number of cattle exhibited at the Expo Junior Show, exhibitors must be willing to accept the fact that space is limited and cooperation must take place in order to make things work for everyone.

AGAIN THIS YEAR EACH COUNTY WILL ONLY BE ALLOWED TO SET UP ONE SET OF SIDE PANELS!

Junior cattle WILL NOT be allowed in the barn until the barn manager gives the ok for you to move into your stalls. **There are four sales scheduled for Thursday and they do have PRIORITY!** Counties which happen to be assigned to stalls which correspond to the sale cattle are asked to respect their right to be there and you will not be allowed to move into those stalls until sale exhibitors have moved out. You will have to remain tied in the baby beef barn until the barn managers give you the ok to move into your aisles.

2012 IMPORTANT IJBBA SHOW RULES

1. The Iowa Junior Beef Breeds Association (I.J.B.B.A.) will be giving an award to members who accumulate the greatest number of points in a given year in each breed (See rule #4). Breed classes and year-end awards will only be offered to those breeds, which are paid members of the Iowa Beef Breeds Council (I.B.B.C.). A show year will run from Winter Expo to 30 days after the last IJBBA-sanctioned show.
2. In order to earn points, exhibitors must be a paid member of the Iowa Junior Beef Breeds Association and each breed association in which they are exhibiting. Points will not be accumulated prior to the date membership dues are paid.
3. The Iowa Junior Beef Breeds Association (I.J.B.B.A.) will be giving an award to the Supreme Breeding Heifer Exhibitor and Supreme Market Animal Exhibitor. This will be based on the number of Supreme titles an exhibitor accumulates through the show season. Supreme titles will NOT be counted if the exhibitor does not show their own animal. In case of a tie, the number of Reserve Supreme titles will determine the winner.
4. I.J.B.B.A. members must exhibit at six shows to receive the year-end awards presented by the I.J.B.B.A.
5. Points shall be earned on the following basis:

Classes must have no more than 15 head per class.

The I.J.B.B.A. reserves the right to correct point standings at any time during the year.

6. All I.J.B.B.A. sanctioned shows must select champions and reserves for each breed, as well as a Top 5 for Supreme Champion Market Animal and Supreme Champion Breeding Heifer.
 - Points for these animals will be awarded as follows:
 - A. Supreme Champion will earn 30 points, and their class points will be replaced with the 1st place points of the largest class of the day.
 - B. Reserve Supreme will earn 25 points, and their class points will be replaced with the 1st place points of the largest class of the day.
 - C. 3rd Overall will earn 22 points, and their class points will be replaced with the 1st place points of the largest class of the day.
 - D. 4th Overall will earn 20 points, and their class points will be replaced with the 1st place points of the largest class of the day.
 - E. 5th Overall will earn 18 points, and their class points will be replaced with the 1st place points of the largest class of the day.
 - F. All other Breed Champions will earn 5 points, and their class points will be replaced with the 1st place points of the largest class of within their breed.
 - G. All other Breed Reserves will earn 3 points, and their class points will be replaced with the 1st place points of the largest class of within their breed.
7. All points recorded in a class are based on the actual number of cattle that enter the show ring for that particular class.
8. Shows may allow open class exhibitors who have not reached their 21st birthday as of January 1, 2012, but the open class exhibitors' points will be void and IJBBA members' points will not be realigned.
9. At a show, if one person exhibits a large number of cattle, only their three highest-point-earning breeding heifers/market animals from that day will be counted for his/her top ten points. However, all of their animals will receive points within their respective breed divisions for that day.
10. Sanctioned shows must offer breed/commercial/crossbred classes for steers and heifers regardless of the number entered.
11. In order for any points to be awarded, the cattle must be owned by, entered in the name of, and shown by the individual IJBBA member, the only exception being if the exhibitor has two or more animals in the same class.
12. Exhibitors must meet the age requirements of their respective Junior Breed Associations. I.J.B.B.A. members cannot have reached their 21st birthday prior to January 1, 2012.
13. I.J.B.B.A. sanctioned shows must offer Market Heifer shows. A Champion and Reserve Champion High Point Market Heifer Award will be given at year-end. All I.J.B.B.A. sanctioned shows must allow the Champion Market Heifer to compete against the steers for a Supreme Market Animal of the show. Year-end over all top ten-market animals will be selected from both Market Steers and Market Heifer exhibitors.
14. If an animal is disruptive to its class, it is at the discretion of the show management to dismiss it from that class. If the animal is dismissed during a championship class, the exhibitor will be disqualified and will lose only the points acquired in the championship class. The reserve animal will then move up to compete for champion, and no other animal will replace the reserve.
15. Breeding Heifers must be born after 9-1-10. Market Animals must be born in 2011.
16. Use of hemp hair, removed hair, or other hair-like materials added to the animal's body will not be allowed. I.J.B.B.A. does not allow surgical or any other alterations to the animals such as the use of permanent dyes or paints to alter the animals original color pattern. Exhibitors found in violation of this rule will be stripped of all their points and premiums for that day and all animals will be disqualified from the remainder of the show. After their third offense, it will be considered a code of conduct violation and will be handled accordingly.
17. Exhibitors are not allowed to "fill" animals by using any artificial means of drenching such as pumps or bottles. Exhibitors found in violation of this rule will be stripped of all their points and premiums for that day and all animals will be disqualified from the remainder of the show. After their third offense, it will be considered a code of conduct violation and will be handled accordingly.

18. All breed associations reserve the right to blood-type/DNA/retinal eye scan any cattle being shown within their breed divisions. Request for blood-type/DNA testing/retinal eye scan can come from the breed association or the I.J.B.B.A. at any sanctioned show throughout the year beginning with the Iowa Beef Expo. Should testing reveal that the animal has been misrepresented on its registration papers, the exhibitor will be immediately withdrawn from the point program within that respective breed for the remainder of the year and any points previously earned in that breed division will be void. This applies both to steers and heifers.
19. At Breed Field Days, exhibitors will receive points only for their breed and class placings. They will not receive any Top 5 (aka "Supreme") points, and they will not be considered for the Supreme Exhibitor competition.
 - At Field Days where animals are only allowed to show as "Owned" OR "Bred & Owned" (not both), the divisions will be considered as separate shows for the purpose of points.
 - At Field Days where animals may be shown in BOTH "Owned" AND "Bred & Owned" divisions, exhibitors will receive the highest points earned for each animal (regardless of which show they competed in). Animals will NOT receive points for BOTH "Owned" AND "Bred & Owned" shows, only the points for each animal which were highest.
20. Site-specific protests must be filed at the IJBBA Sanctioned Show. Any person wishing to have an animal inspected is required to submit a written protest and be accompanied by \$100.00. The person placing the protest is responsible for all costs incurred to verify the protest. Written protest must state plainly the cause of the complaint and must be filed before the championship drive at the sanctioned show. If inspection is not sustained, the protest money will be forfeited. Protests will be handled by the breed association involved, crossbred protests will be handled by the Executive Director and the IJBBA Advisors.
21. Conduct. Any unsportsmanlike conduct or misrepresentation on the part of an I.J.B.B.A. member will not be tolerated. All I.J.B.B.A. members are expected to be cooperative and courteous at all times. Any I.J.B.B.A. member not complying with this rule is subject to disqualification or any other steps deemed desirable.
22. Dress Code: All I.J.B.B.A. members must exhibit in a collared/crew neck shirt with sleeves/short sleeves and the shirt must remain tucked in at all times during exhibition. Any I.J.B.B.A. member not complying with the dress code will be disqualified.
23. If a sanctioned IJBBA show receives a bad check for an entry fee, IJBBA requests that show management contact the exhibitor and give them 10 days to submit a cashiers check/money order or cash to their show for reimbursement of their entry fee. Show management must also notify an IJBBA Advisor immediately. This exhibitor will automatically forfeit that day's show points. If after one bad check has been written and not cleared by the exhibitor, this exhibitor will not be allowed to participate in any other IJBBA sanctioned shows for the remainder of the year. If an exhibitor writes 3 or more bad checks during the 2012 show season, whether they make good on them or not, the exhibitor will be stripped of all points accumulated for the year along with their IJBBA membership for 2012.
24. Sanctioned shows are required to submit a \$150 deposit to the IJBBA upon sanctioning. \$50 of this deposit will be refunded if the show turns in their show results within one week of the show's completion. \$50 will be refunded if the show results are submitted on the official Excel Show Results Template from the IJBBA.

Iowa Beef Expo Heifer Awards

The Iowa Beef Breeds Council has started a program in which each breed holding a sale at the Iowa Beef Expo will have the opportunity to present a \$500.00 Iowa Beef Expo Heifer Award sponsored by the Iowa Beef Breeds Council to a junior exhibitor who purchased and exhibited a heifer from their breed sale. Each breed association has been asked to develop their own criteria for this award. Listed below are the two requirements of the Iowa Beef Breeds Council. Heifers will be ranked at the discretion of each breed association under the following conditions:

1. The heifer must have been purchased in an Iowa Beef Expo sanctioned sale and exhibited by a junior at the 2012 Iowa State Fair.
2. Only one heifer per breed sale (12 total) will be awarded. Therefore, high and low percentage cattle will be considered for one award. Furthermore, cattle with multiple breed registrations may only be awarded by the breed association which sold those cattle at the 2012 Iowa Beef Expo.

ALL BREED CHAMPIONS AND RESERVES MUST STAY FOR CHAMPIONSHIP SELECTION! We will be selecting a TOP 5 during the Championship Drive. Any exhibitor who shows a Champion or Reserve Breed Steer or Heifer must stay for the Championship Drive selection in order to receive points and premiums.

HEIFERS PURCHASED AT THE 2012 IOWA BEEF EXPO

SALES ARE ELIGIBLE FOR THE JUNIOR SHOW

The only exception which will be made for entries received after February 1st for the junior show will be for show heifers which are purchased in one of the sales held during the 2012 Expo. If you purchase a heifer from one of the Expo Sales, and you desire to show it on Saturday or Sunday, you should report to the cattle barn office after the sale and let the office manager know you will be exhibiting on the weekend. The information is necessary in order to reserve stall space for you. **The entry fee for sale heifers is \$25 and must be paid at time of check-in.**

STALLING & SIDE PANELS

All junior cattle will be stalled by county. **EACH COUNTY WILL ONLY BE ALLOWED TO SET UP ONE SET OF SIDE PANELS.** Counties will be randomly assigned an appropriate number of stalls based on entries received. Exhibitors from each county will be responsible for working out their own stalling arrangement within their assigned stalls. Due to the volume of entries, there is a possibility that some counties will be stalled in the tie-out barn. Because of the very large number of cattle which are entered, exhibitors will only be allowed one stall per entry and no tack space or tie-outs will be guaranteed.

ARRIVAL TIMES FOR JUNIOR CATTLE

Because we will be checking in ALL junior cattle on Friday, February 17th, junior exhibitors may arrive late Thursday evening and go to the tie-outs until we can get cattle into the open class barn. We will get as many junior cattle into the barn Thursday evening as possible, however,

NO JUNIOR CATTLE WILL BE ALLOWED IN THE OPEN CLASS BARN UNTIL THE BARN MANAGERS GIVE THE OK. THE OPEN CLASS BARN WILL BE CLOSED TO ALL IJBBA EXHIBITORS FOR SALES AND CLEANING FROM 3:00 P.M. - 9:00 P.M.

Many exhibitors will be allowed in the barn late Thursday evening, but because the Chianina Sale will be held on Thursday evening, counties assigned stalls in those aisles will not be allowed in the barn until Friday morning. Final stalling assignments will not be made available until Thursday, February 16th so please don't call and ask for them until that time.

DNA/BLOOD-TYPING

All breed associations reserve the right to blood-type/DNA/retinal eye scan any cattle being shown within their breed divisions. Request for blood-type/DNA testing/retinal eye scan can come from the breed association or the I.J.B.A. at any sanctioned show throughout the year beginning with the Iowa Beef Expo. Should testing reveal that the animal has been misrepresented on its registration papers, the exhibitor will be immediately withdrawn from the point program for the remainder of the year and any points previously earned will be void. This applies both to steers and heifers.

ATTENTION! IMPORTANT EXPO RULES

NO LATE ENTRIES ALLOWED: Absolutely no late entries will be allowed. Entries must be postmarked by February 1st. Only junior heifers purchased in one of the Expo sales will be allowed late entry.

COMMON BEDDING: All cattle (sale cattle, live display, junior cattle) will be stalled on a common bedding that will be in place upon the exhibitors arrival at the show. **NO** additional bedding of any type will be allowed to be placed on top of this bedding. The tie-out area will also be bedded.

SIDE PANELS: Each county will only be allowed to set up one set of side panels.

PUMPS: Exhibitors are not allowed to "fill" animals by using any artificial means of drenching such as pumps or bottles.

FANS: There will be **NO** allowance for fans placed in any of the cattle aisles. The use of butt fans is prohibited. Fans hanging on blocking chutes are also prohibited. Only hanging, overhead stall fans will be allowed in any of the cattle barns. Due to limited space, management reserves the right to limit exhibitors on the number of and arrangement of fan equipment. If it is excessive and infringes on the rights of other exhibitors.

GENERATORS & SPACE HEATERS: NO GENERATORS OR SPACE HEATERS OR GAS CANS ALLOWED IN THE BARN OR TIE-OUTS.

HEALTH PAPERS: **NO** animals will be allowed to show without presenting a valid approved health certificate at check-in which meets all Iowa health requirements. Exhibitors will have to present health papers in order to be released from the show as well.

RINGWORM: Any evidence of ringworm, warts, foot rot, pinkeye, draining abscesses or any other contagious disease will eliminate JR. cattle from the show and the Expo grounds. The Iowa Beef Expo Veterinarian reserves the right to final judgement on ringworm assessment. No tolerance on ringworm will be allowed unless the Expo Vet determines the condition has been treated and is in the healing stage.

Registration Papers Must Accompany Animal Through Check-in!

Angus - Steers and heifers must have registration papers in hand at time of check-in; no fax copies will be accepted. Papers must be in the junior exhibitor's name. All animals must have readable tattoos. All exhibitors must follow the rules of the American Angus Association.

Belgian Blue - Steers and heifers must be 50% or greater and have registration papers or meat certificate in hand at time of check-in. The youth may show animals, which the youth has ownership of and/or animals owned by the family farm and/or ranch.

Brangus - Must be branded or tattooed and have papers registered in the exhibitor's name.

Charolais - Steers must be at least 50% or higher. The steer must have a certificate of recordation with the AICA and be 100% owned by the junior and in the exhibitor's name only. Purebred heifers registration papers must be 100% owned by the junior and in the exhibitor's name only.

Charolais Composite Heifer - Percentage heifers must be composed of at least 50% and no more than 15/16 Charolais. Heifers must have a certificate of recordation with the AICA and it must be 100% owned by the junior and in the junior exhibitor's name only.

Chianina - All percentages of Chiangus, Chianina, Chimaine, Chiford and CAX (steers & heifers) that are able to be registered are eligible. They must be registered in the exhibitors name and have papers in hand at check-in.

Gelbvieh - Steers must be 50% Gelbvieh or more and exhibitor must have an official Gelbvieh breeder affidavit. Affidavits may be obtained from the American Gelbvieh Association website www.gelbvieh.org or contacting the AGA at 303-465-BEEF. Females must be registered and at least 75% Gelbvieh. Registration papers need to be in the exhibitor's name.

Gelbvieh Balancers - Are 25% to 75% Gelbvieh with the balance Angus or Red Angus. Registration papers need to be in the exhibitor's name.

Herefords:

Polled Herefords - We are one association, but will have two separate heifer shows, steers will be shown polled & horned as one division. Heifers must have registration papers and Steers must have Certificates in hand at time of check-in. Animals may be co-owned with siblings, provided each junior owner is an individual National Junior Hereford member and a member of the Iowa Junior Hereford Association for the year 2011. All exhibitors must follow the rules of the American Junior Hereford Association. **PLEASE** make sure you check your registration papers for entries in Polled or Horned Division. Questions, contact Tena Biddle at 563-843-2595.

Horned Herefords - We are one association, but will have two separate heifer shows, steers will be shown polled & horned as one division. Heifers must have registration papers and Steers must have Certificates in hand at time of check-in. Animals may be co-owned with siblings, provided each junior owner is an individual National Junior Hereford member and a member of the Iowa Junior Hereford Association for the year 2011. All exhibitors must follow the rules of the American Junior Hereford Association. **PLEASE** make sure you check your registration papers for entries in Polled or Horned Division. Questions, contact Tena Biddle at 563-843-2595.

Limousin - Steers must be registered and be 50% or greater Limousin blood. Heifers must be 75% or greater Limousin blood and have an orange NALF registration paper. Must have registration papers in hand at check-in and be in the exhibitor's name.

Lim-Flex Females - Females registered as Lim-Flex with a purple NALF registration certificate will be eligible to compete. 75% Lim-Flex females are not eligible for the Limousin female show. Must have registration papers in hand at check-in and be in the exhibitor's name.

Lowlines - would like to offer 2 divisions—one for Steers and one for Heifers. All Lowlines must be registered as 3/4 or higher in order to be eligible for show. For more breed requirements contact Doug Dodd at 515-709-0509.

Maine Anjou - MaineTainer heifers will include ¼ to 5/8 Maine Anjou females. High Percentage heifers will include ¾ and above females. Steers and MaineTainers no longer must be sired by a Maine Anjou registered bull. If your MaineTainer or Steer is registered with the AMAA, you will be able to show at all IJBBA shows from this point forward. If heifers are purchased at the 2012 Iowa Beef Expo and desire to show in the junior show, they must have been purchased through the Maine-Anjou sale. All exhibitors must have original registration papers in hand at time of check-in and papers need to be solely in the junior exhibitor's name. All animals must have legible and correct tattoos. Exhibitor's must be a member of the Iowa Junior Maine-Anjou Association and pay a \$10.00 annual fee. All exhibitors must follow the rules of the American Junior Maine-Anjou Association.

Murray Grey - To be eligible to show in the Murray Grey division, heifers must be 7/8 Purebred or above and be registered with the American Murray Grey Association and meet all breed rules and regulations of the AMGA. To be eligible to show in the Murray Grey steer division, steers must be 50% Murray Grey or above and they must be registered with the American Murray Grey Association as half-blood or above.

Red Angus - Steers must be 50% or more Red Angus from one registered parent, be predominately red in color and display sufficient breed characteristics, which match % of registration. Heifers must be 87% or higher Red Angus. Steer & Heifer registration papers must be in hand at check in and must be in the exhibitor's name.

Salers - Animals must be 50% or more Salers with either the dam or sire being registered. Both steers and heifers must have registration papers and the papers must be in the name of the junior exhibitor.

Simmental - Steers must have registration paper in hand and be ½ blood or higher. Foundation heifers include 50% - 74% and Purebred heifers included 75% and above and must have registration paper in hand. Registration papers must be in the exhibitor's name or family farm name.

Simbrah Females - 5/8 SM - 3/8 BR and must have registration paper in hand. Registration papers must be in the exhibitor's name or family farm name.

Shorthorn - Heifers and Steers must be at least 15/16 and must be registered solely in the junior exhibitor's name.

ShorthornPlus - Heifers and Steers must be between 1/2 and 7/8 Shorthorn and must have appendix registration papers solely in the junior exhibitor's name.

South Devon - Heifers must be ¾ or higher and have registration papers. Steers must be registered and sired by a registered ¾ or higher bull. Papers must be in hand at check-in. Registration papers must be in the exhibitor's name.

HEIFERS:

Breeding Heifers must be born after 9-1-10. All breeding heifers must be registered with their respective breed association and conform to their Iowa Breed Association rules for registration and exhibition. **Commercial heifers will be shown by weight and classes will be divided into 3 divisions.** All heifers must be owned by the exhibitor. Heifers may only be shown in a breed show or as a crossbred.

MARKET ANIMALS:

Must be born in 2011. Steers must be entered in the breed class of which they show a predominance of such breed characteristics. Please refer to classification of breed rules to enter steers in their correct breed. Steers will be classified by breed with uniform class breaks by weight. No re-weighs. Steers that do not meet breed class guidelines will be put in the crossbred class. **Crossbred Steers and Market heifers will be shown by weight and classes will be divided into 3 divisions.**

GENERAL:

Exhibitors must be present to show their own calf. Absolutely no substitute showmen will be allowed. No cattle will be shown by anyone except by the person's whose name the calf is entered in, the only exception is if an exhibitor has two or more animals in one class.

All exhibitors must be a paid member of the Iowa Jr. Beef Breeds Association. **No out of state exhibitors, steers or heifers are allowed. BREED CLASS EXHIBITORS MUST ALSO BELONG TO THEIR RESPECTIVE IOWA JR. 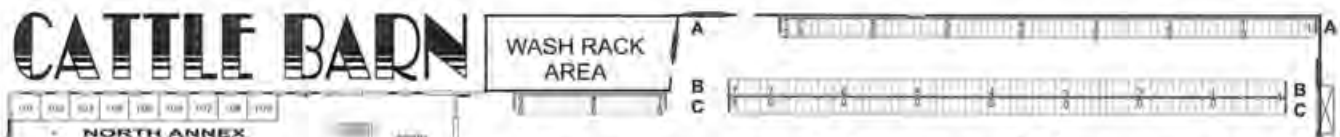
Iowa Junior Beef Breeds Association Exhibitors for Education
