

Breed classes must be offered for breeding heifers regardless of the number entered in a breed division. Here is a list of the most common breeds.

Angus	Charolais	Composite (Low % Charolais)
Chi	ChiAngus	Gelbvieh
Balancer	Limousin	Limflex
Commercial	Maine Anjou	Maintainer
Red Angus	Shorthorn	Shorthorn Plus
Simmental	Foundation Simmental	Hereford Polled and Horned

*The list above are breeds that need to be offered to breeding heifers, since no breed associations recognizes low percent steers the only low percent steer class should be shorthorn plus.

*All JNC sanctioned shows must select both a Supreme and Reserve Supreme Breeding Heifer for individual breeds, each champion should be in the final drive.

**** Rule Change as of November 1, 2008. ****

*Sanctioned Shows are required to check registration papers **ON BOTH STEERS AND HEIFERS**, and it is suggested tattoos be checked on all breeding heifers at check-in to verify the animals are correctly entered. Otherwise they must show in the Commercial Class.

Breeding heifer classes will be broken according to age:

January/February

March/April

May/ June

July/ August

September/October/November/December

This break down follows national shows regulations.

*If there are too many calves in a class, classes can be broke down by individual months. For example a January Class and a February Class.

Showmanship break downs need to follow the JNC ages by January 1st.

Senior: 16 and up

Intermediate: 12-15

Junior: 8-11

* A Grand and Reserve Champion must be picked for overall. A small show must pick the top three, top five on medium, and top seven on large shows. The same for the Market Animals, the market heifer (no breeds) is represented as another breed of steers.

*Official results must be sent to the Junior Nebraska Cattlemen president within 7 days of the show in order to receive the 50% refund of the sanctioning fee. Results may be given to a JNC advisor at the end of the show or emailed to Kelsey.lamb@us.army.mil.
